- Educates patient and family/responsible party regarding disease process, individual care needs, wellness, safety issues, etc.
- Delegates and monitors care rendered by other members of the nursing department and health care team.
- Demonstrates standard precautions and patient safety principles in practice.
- Participates in orientation, education, and development of the health care team.
- Identifies and participates in performance improvement activities.
- Maintains professional and departmental level competencies.
- Advocates for the safe, judicious, and appropriate use and disposal of products in health care.
