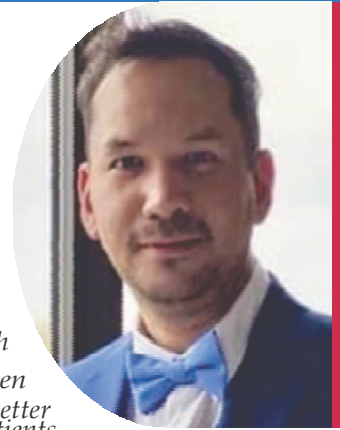


Board Member Perspective
